

New York District Rose Show Schedule

Saturday, September 10, 2022

Horticulture Section Rules

1. All exhibitors must be amateur rose growers whose exhibited roses were grown outdoors in their own garden.
2. Exhibitors may make only one entry per household in each of the Challenge Classes in Section A unless otherwise specified. In Section B, not more than one (1) entry of the same variety will be allowed in any class from the same garden.
3. All exhibitors must be registered for the convention.
4. Judging will be done according to *ARS Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses revised 2021*.
5. Uniform containers and entry tags are provided and must be used.
6. Each exhibit will be entered by variety name and arranged in alphabetical order in the proper class. The entry tag must bear correct the section/class and the American Exhibition Name (AEN).
7. First place, second place, third place and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded in every class where merited. Only blue-ribbon winners are eligible for Court of Honor awards.
8. All exhibits, trophies and awards must remain intact until the close of the show. All entries become the property of the New York District with the exception of the arrangements and photographs.
9. The convention committee, Syracuse Rose Society, New York District ARS and Collegian Hotel assume no responsibility for loss of or damage to personal property.
10. Entries may be placed by the exhibitor from 6:30 AM to 9:30 AM Saturday, September 10, 2022. No entries will be permitted after 9:30 AM. Judging will begin promptly at 10:00 A.M.
11. Only authorized show committee members will be allowed in the show room until after the judging is completed.
12. All decisions of the judges are final.
13. Reasons for disqualification are: foreign substance applied to enhance the beauty of the entry, misnamed, unlabeled or mislabeled, exhibitor's name visible, roses not outdoor grown or not grown by the exhibitor, violation of show rules.

SECTION A

Challenge Classes

Exhibitors may make only one entry per household in each class in this section unless otherwise specified.
In Classes A-1 thru A-4 each container must have an individual entry tag.
In Classes A-5 thru A-17 use challenge class tags.

A - Class 1

J. HORACE MCFARLAND DISTRICT TROPHY

Six (6) hybrid tea blooms, different varieties in separate containers; at exhibition stage. Open only to those members of the American Rose Society residing in the New York District. Should fewer than three (3) exhibits be entered, the class will not be judged unless, in the opinion of the judges, the exhibit is outstanding and merits the honor.

A - Class 2

RALPH S. MOORE DISTRICT TROPHY

Seven (7) miniature blooms, different varieties in separate containers; at exhibition stage. Open only to those members of the American Rose Society residing in the New York District. Should fewer than three (3) exhibits be entered, the class will not be judged unless, in the opinion of the judges, the exhibit is outstanding and merits the honor.

A - Class 3

GRIFFITH BUCK TROPHY

Three shrub roses, mix or match varieties, in separate containers, one-bloom-per-stem or spray. Open only to those members of the American Rose Society residing in the New York District

A - Class 4

J. BEN WILLIAMS TROPHY

Collection of five (5) miniflora blooms, one-bloom-per-stem, mix or match varieties, in separate containers. Open only to those members of the American Rose Society residing in the New York District.

A - Class 5

ALL-AMERICAN ROSE SELECTIONS (AARS) TROPHY

Three (3) AARS hybrid tea blooms, one-bloom-per-stem, different varieties, in one (1) container. Open only to those members of the American Rose Society residing in the New York District.

A - Class 6

ORANGE CHALLENGE

Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem large roses (Miniatures and Minifloras excluded) classified as orange & orange blend, orange-pink & o-p blend, or orange-red & o-r blend, mix or match; shown at any stage; in one vase.

A - Class 7

SRS PROJECT ROSE

Tiffany Lynn or Foolish Pleasure; one-bloom-per-stem, at exhibition stage. Exhibitor may enter one specimen of each variety. Open to Syracuse Rose Society members only.

A - Class 8

SEEDLINGS

An exhibit of any rose grown from seed by the exhibitor. Parentage should be listed as completely as possible on the tag: (Female (seed parent) x Male (pollen parent)). For example (Bonica x Unknown). May be exhibited as a blooming potted plant or any exhibition specimen. Limited to six (6) seedlings per exhibitor.

A - Class 9

HYBRID TEA CYCLE OF BLOOM

All the same variety, one-bloom-per-stem; one bud showing color, one exhibition stage bloom, one open bloom with stamens showing in one container.

A - Class 10

LARGE ENGLISH BOX

One or any combination of varieties of any class of rose except miniatures or minifloras in an English Box. Any stage permitted. Foliage is not permitted.

A - Class 11

LARGE ROSE IN A FRAME

One bloom of a hybrid tea, grandiflora, floribunda, shrub, climber or OGR displayed in an 8" x 10" picture frame. Any stage permitted. Rose foliage permitted.

A - Class 12

LARGE ROSE IN A BOWL

One bloom of any class of rose except miniature or miniflora floated in a bowl of clear water. Any stage permitted. Foliage is not permitted.

A - Class 13

MINIATURE OR MINIFLORA CYCLE OF BLOOM

All the same variety, one-bloom-per-stem; one bud showing color, one exhibition stage bloom and one open bloom with stamens showing, exhibited in one container.

A - Class 14

MINIATURE ENGLISH BOX

One or any combination of varieties. Any stage permitted. Foliage is not permitted.

A - CLASS 15

SMALL ROSE IN A FRAME

One bloom of a miniature or miniflora displayed in a 5" x 7" picture frame. Any stage permitted. Rose foliage permitted.

A - Class 16

MINIATURE ROSE IN A BOWL

One miniature bloom without foliage, floated in a bowl of clear water. Any stage permitted.

A - Class 17

MINIFLORA ROSE IN A BOWL

One miniflora bloom without foliage, floated in a bowl of clear water. Any stage permitted.

A - Class 18

HI-LO

Exhibition stage blooms of one Miniature or Miniflora and one Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora exhibited in separate containers. Matched for form, color and degree of openness as closely as possible.

A - Class 19

FRAGRANCE

One bloom. Scored 70% on fragrance, 30% on horticultural excellence.

SECTION B

Horticulture Classes

B - Class 20

Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras, and climbing sports of these types — one-bloom-per-stem at exhibition stage.

B - Class 21

Hybrid Teas — one spray.

B - Class 22

Grandifloras — one spray.

B - Class 23

Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora – one open bloom (with stamens showing).

B - Class 24

Floribundas — one-bloom-per-stem at exhibition stage.

B - Class 25

Floribundas — one spray.

B - Class 26

Polyanthas — one spray.

B - Class 27

Climbers — one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Includes only those varieties classified as Large Flowered Climbers (LCI), Hybrid Wichuranas (HWich) and Hybrid Gigantea (HG)

B - Class 28

Old Garden Roses — one-bloom-per-stem or spray; date of introduction prior to 1867, including roses of unknown dates known to have been in existence prior to 1867.

B - Class 29

Old Garden Roses — one-bloom-per-stem or spray; date of introduction 1867 or later, or with unknown dates of origin 1867 or later.

B - Class 30

Species – one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Includes only those varieties classified as Species (Sp).

B - Class 31

Classic Shrubs — one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Includes only those varieties with these classifications; Hybrid Kordesii (HKor), Hybrid Moyesii (HMoy), Hybrid Musk (HMsK) or Hybrid Rugosa (HRg).

B - Class 32

Modern Shrubs – one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Only varieties classified as Shrub (S).

B - Class 33

Miniatures — one-bloom-per-stem at exhibition stage.

B - Class 34

Minifloras — one-bloom-per-stem at exhibition stage.

B - Class 35

Miniatures – one spray.

B - Class 36

Minifloras — one spray.

B - Class 37

Single Miniatures (4-8 petals) — one-bloom-per-stem).

B - Class 38

Single Minifloras (4-8 petals) — one-bloom-per-stem).

B - Class 39

Miniature – one open bloom (with stamens showing).

B - Class 40

Miniflora – one open bloom (with stamens showing).

B - Class 41

Judges' Class — Limited to four entries per judge.

B - Class 42

Novice Classes - Limited to individuals who have never won a blue ribbon in any class in any District or National rose show.

Class 42a: Hybrid Teas or Grandifloras and climbing sports of these types, one-bloom-per-stem at exhibition stage.

Class 42b: Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora spray.

Class 42c: Floribundas – one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Class 42d: Climbers – one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Class 42e: Miniatures & Minifloras, one-bloom-per-stem.

Class 42f: Miniatures & Minifloras, one spray.

Class 42g: Shrubs – one-bloom-per-stem or spray.

Class 42h: Old Garden Roses – one-bloom-per-stem or spray.
